The European Union in the 21st Century



The European Union Center of Excellence will conduct its annual three-week program in Europe in

May of 2007 that will focus on the evolving European Union and its public policy impact.

The course prepares approximately 20 graduate students for professional work in an international policy environment. Students will benefit from hands-on experience with real policy issues in seminars with high-profile public and private executives and policy makers.

The seminars will be held at the following locations:

- Paris - *École Nationale d'Administration*
- Brussels - *NATO, Council of the European Union*
- Warsaw - *National School of Public Administration*
- Berlin - *Green Campus of the Heinrich Böll Foundation*

The program will also include visits to other relevant organizations in France, Belgium, Germany, and Poland. In the evenings and on weekends, students are free to explore and enjoy each locale's social and cultural offerings.

The Program

Typically, this graduate seminar focuses on such matters as:

- The constitutional debate in Europe: the transition to new forms of governance
- The adaptation of major EU nations - particularly France and Germany - to this new paradigm
- The role of the courts in shaping European social, economic, and political life
- NATO and Russia: national and international defense and security policy
- Transatlantic relations in a strategic context
- The changing ethnic composition of Europe and accompanying social, political, and cultural policy issues
- Enlargement to East and Central Europe
- Enlargement with regard to Turkey
- Managing environmental policy in the context of globalization and regionalization
- Harmonizing employment and labor market policy
- Economic development initiatives
- Monetary and fiscal policy issues
- Corporate strategy in a changing European business environment
- Competition and regulatory policy
- Trade policy issues and the WTO

Eligibility and Program Fees

The program is open to all graduate students with an interest in the European Union enrolled in degree programs at US universities. The cost of the 2007 program is \$3950. A \$200 administrative fee will be assessed for non-IU students.

Fees cover the cost of tuition (4 credit hours in Overseas Study, West European Studies W605 Selected Topics in West European Studies, or Russian and East European Institute R500 Russian and East European Issues); readings; accommodations in Europe; and intra-European travel (Warsaw-Berlin-Paris-Brussels).

Airfare, food, and daily personal expenses are not included.

Program Leader

Luise McCarty, Professor in Philosophy of Education, is the leader of the 2007 program. A native of Germany, Professor McCarty specializes in comparative educational policy.
