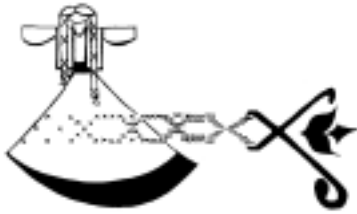

FEATURED COURSES:

RUES 199 - POLITICAL ELITES, OPPOSITION, AND YOUTH AT THE END OF CZECH COMMUNISM: USING THE ORAL HISTORY METHOD

This course will explore the methodology of oral history and its necessity when focusing on the communist states of East Central Europe. The course will look at current research in the oral history of Czechoslovakia, specifically the fall of Communism and its effects on elites, anti-elites (dissidents), and youth in the 1970s and 1980s. RUES 199 - TRENDS IN CONTEMPORARY RUSSIAN POLITICS

The course will focus on the Yeltsin years, and the political considerations that affected the major policies, as well as the two wars in Chechnya, the state of human rights in the country, including the rights of women, and Russia's role in the world, post-empire.
