## Fall Reception

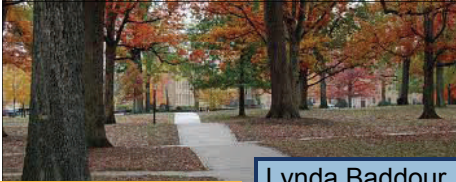

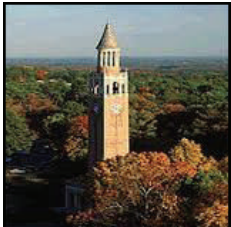

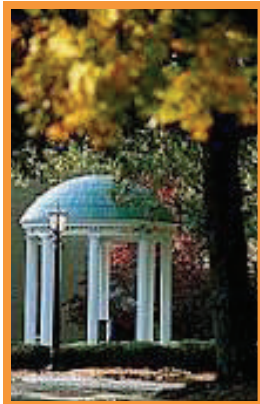
