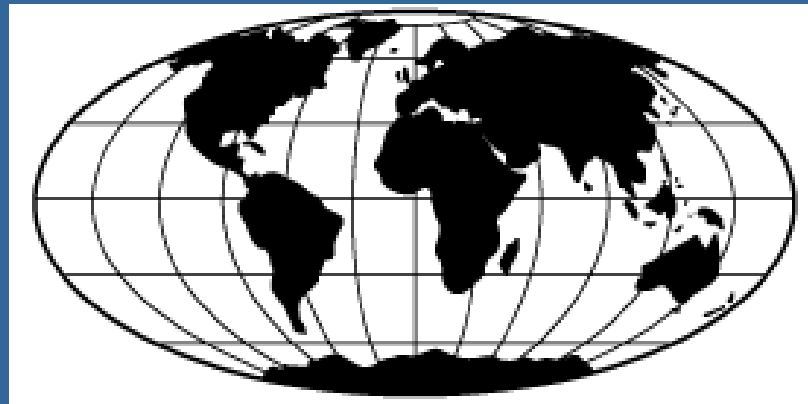

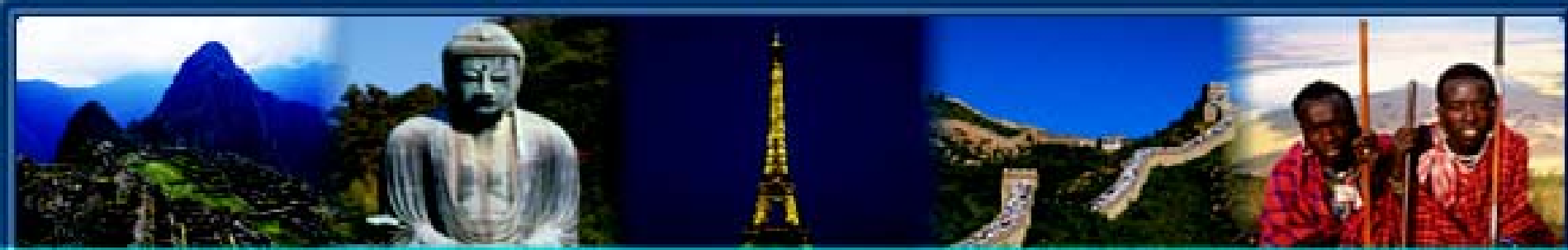

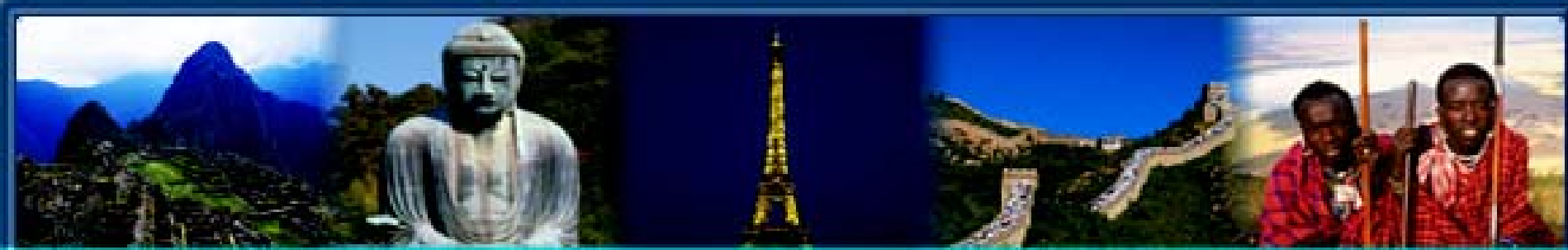

Help schools and colleges prepare students to succeed in an interconnected world in which the rules have changed for everyone.

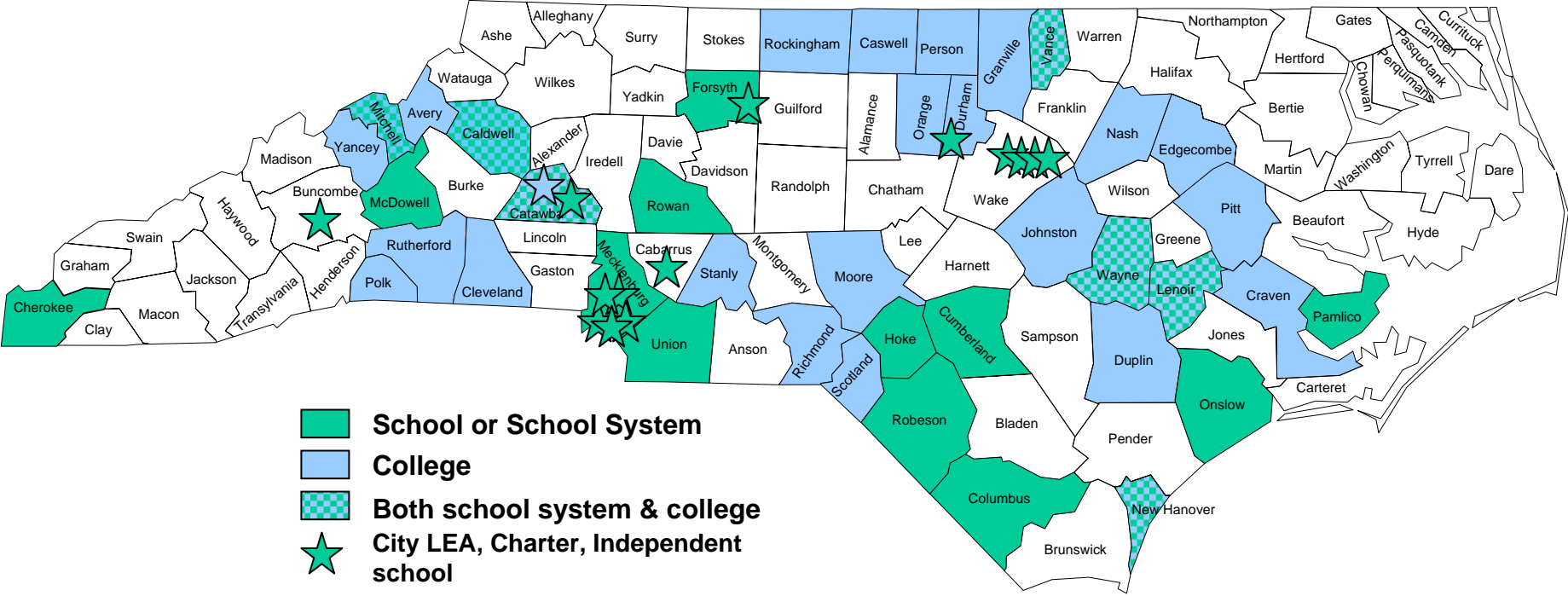

# A Global Student

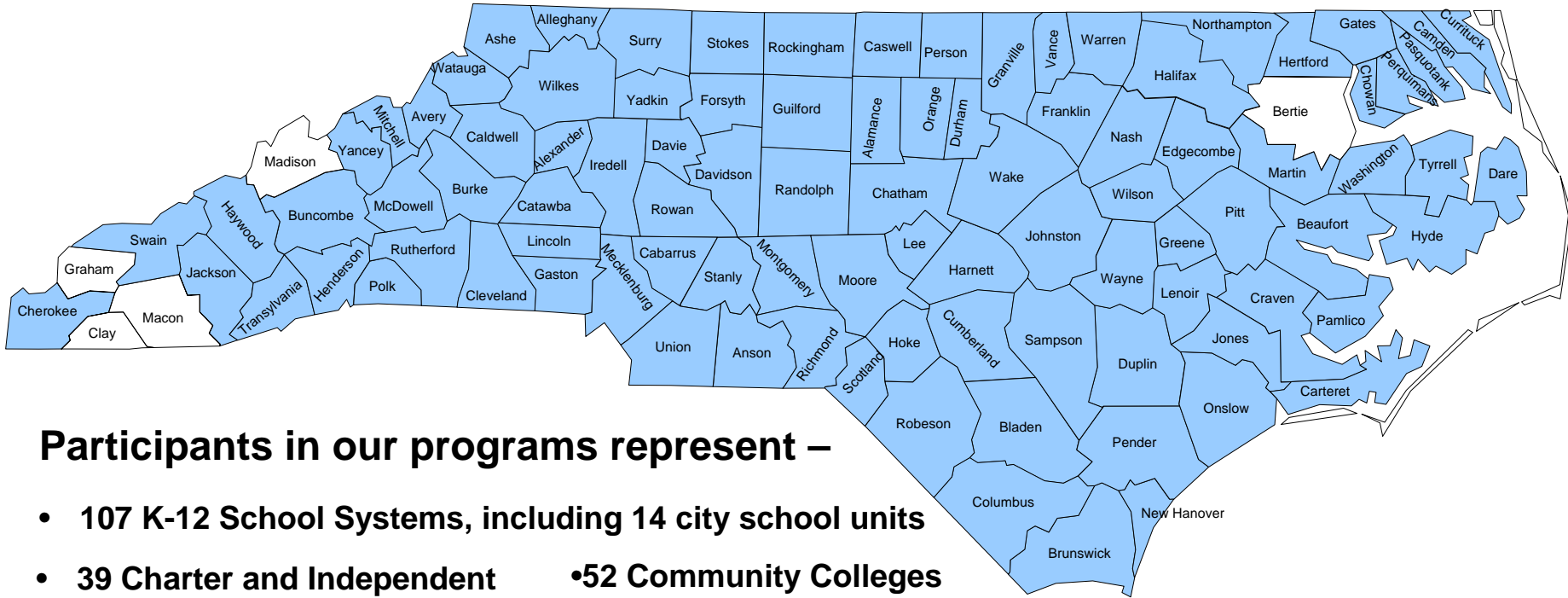
1. Knows how to keep learning

# Participants in World View Programs (1998-2007)

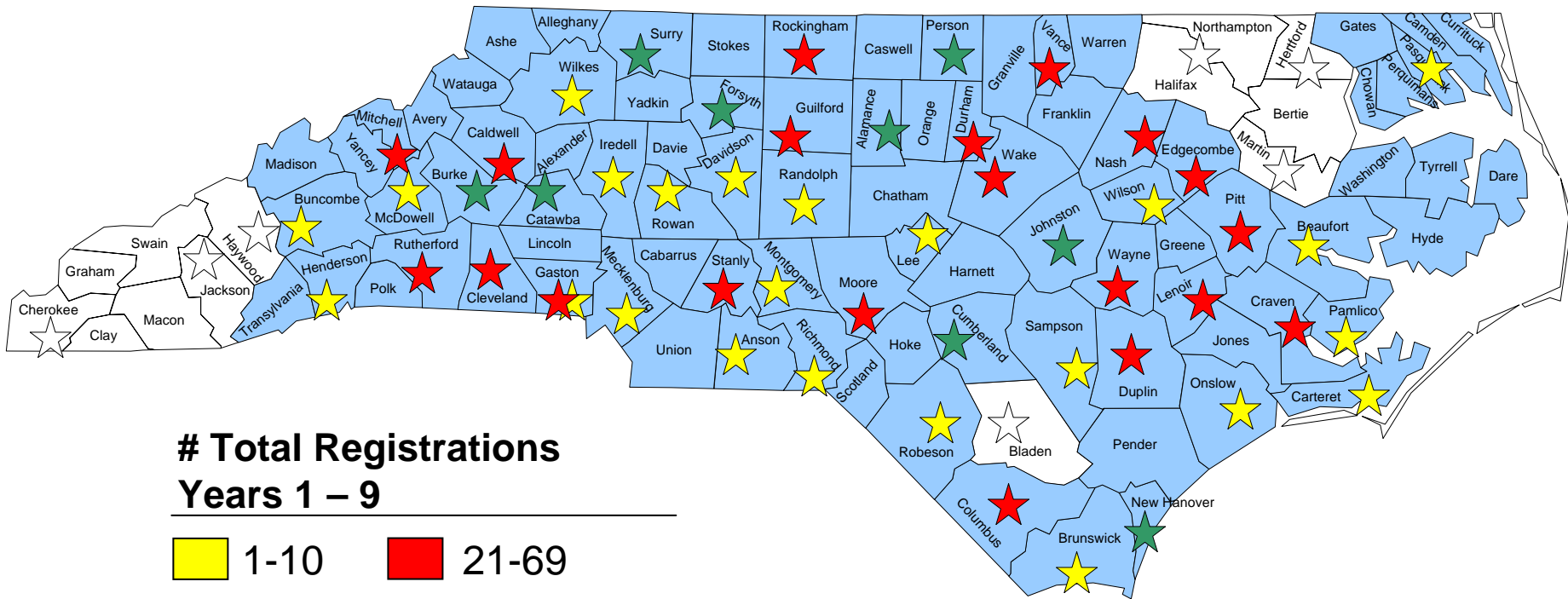


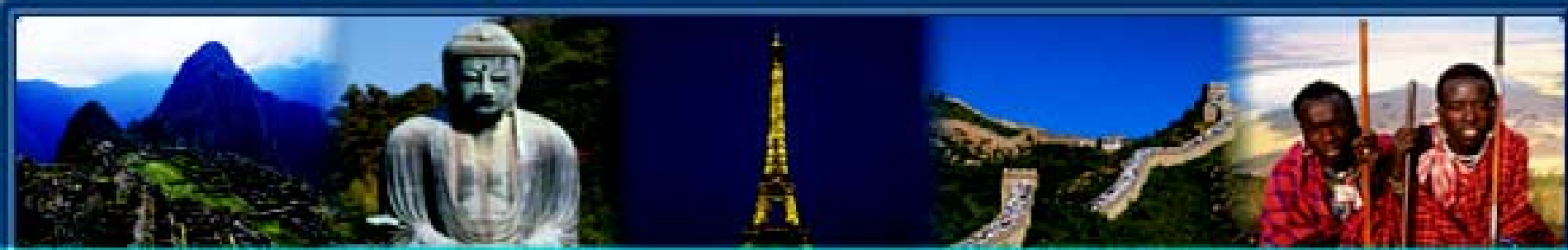
## Participants in our programs represent –

# Participants of World View Programs Community Colleges



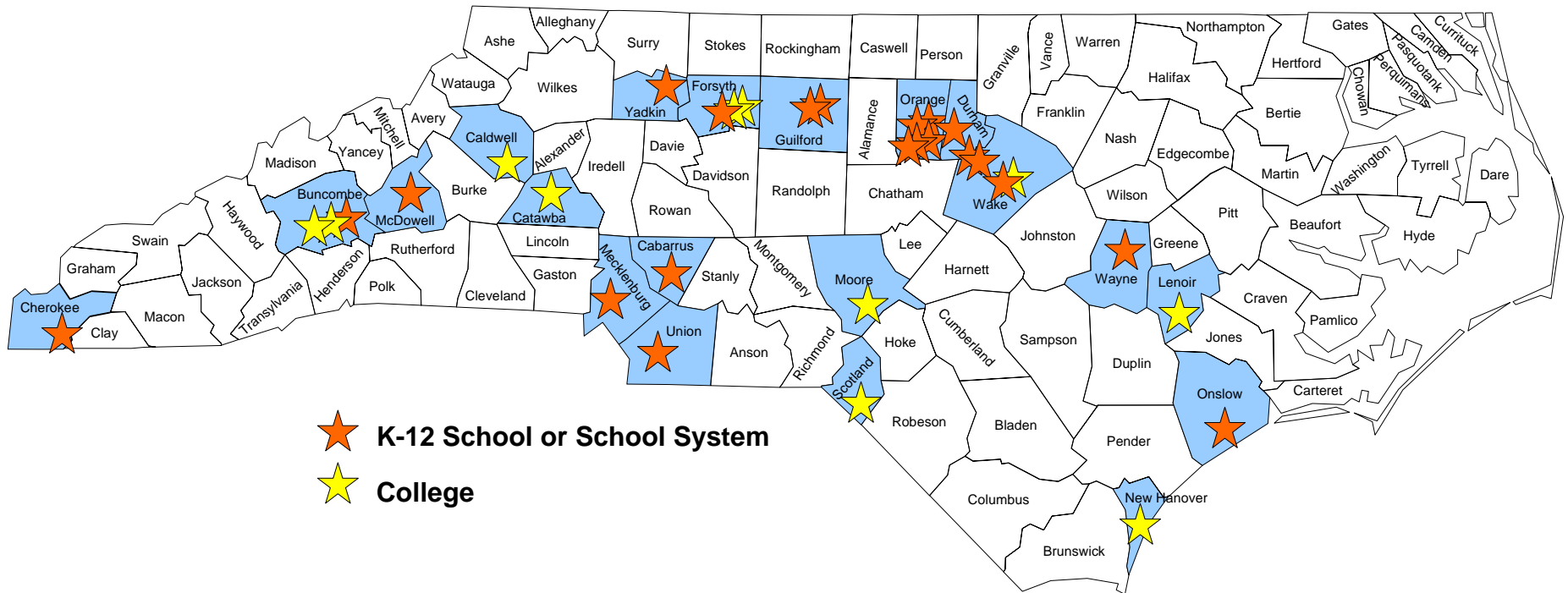


# Outreach Services and Curriculum Development
