The Hillsborough Police Department is located in historic downtown Hillsborough. Hillsborough is Orange County's county seat and the beginning of the town can be traced to 1100 A.D.



The Hillsborough Police Department is composed of 4 Divisions.

The C.O.P. division works on preventative policing, and establishes and maintains a positive police presence in the community. The C.O.P. division has organized several service projects including an Explorer Post and an "adopt a cop" program. Officers often speak at community events, as well.

Another part of the HPD is the Patrol Division. Patrol is considered the backbone of the police department. Patrol officers respond to 911 calls, take accident reports, and monitor businesses and residences at night.

The third division of the HPD is the Investigative Division which is composed of two departments, criminal and narcotics. Criminal officers handle a variety of issues, including theft, homicide and domestic disputes. Narcotics officers handle drug-related crimes and have access to the K-9 unit.
