

Grading and Attendance Policy Revisions for Econ 101H in Light of H1N1

Attendance Policy

Very regular attendance is expected of students who are well. Students who have contracted flu or who exhibit flu-like symptoms are required to stay away from classes until they are fever free for 24 hours.

Quizzes

I am planning six quizzes for the semester. I will only count the highest four for each student in order to allow for absences due to the flu.

Journal

Course journals will be collected once or twice during the semester and again at the end. The due dates will always be announced a week in advance. Students who are ill may have a friend turn in their journal to the Economic Department office, 108 Gardner Hall. A journal turned in by 5:00 pm on the due date will be considered on time. Late penalties will apply to late submissions.

Graded Homework Assignments

Graded homework assignments will always be announced one week or more in advance. There will be two or three of these during the semester. Students who are ill may have a friend turn in their homework to the Economic Department office, 108 Gardner Hall. A homework turned in by 5:00 pm on the due date will be considered on time. Late penalties will apply to late submissions.

Midterm Examinations

Students who report to Professor Salemi prior to a midterm examination that they have the flu or flu-like symptoms will be excused from the midterm examination.

In class midterm exams are on Thursdays. Students who are ill may take a makeup exam for their midterm up until 4:00 pm on the Monday following the midterm. They should contact Professor Salemi and arrange a time.

Students who are ill beyond the makeup window are still excused. For them, the makeup exam will be the relevant portion of the final examination.
